



## Container Placement

**On your collection day, place your containers:**

- In front of your house by 6:00 a.m., but not earlier than the evening beforehand;
- Facing the street (arrow on the container lid should point towards the street);
- With wheels against the curb;
- At least three feet from any obstruction such as trees, parked vehicles, and mailboxes; and
- At least one foot from each other.

Containers must be off the street by the evening of the collection day.

Materials should not stick out of the top of the container. Do not set any items on top of the container.

## Holidays

Refuse and recycling collection will be delayed by one day when a holiday is before your collection day. The City of Ontario observes the following holidays:

<b>January</b> - New Year's Day	<b>September</b> - Labor Day
<b>February</b> - President's Day	<b>November</b> - Veteran's Day
<b>May</b> - Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day
<b>July</b> - Independence Day	<b>December</b> - Christmas

## Temporary Bin Service

For one time projects around the house four yard bins are available for a seven day rental. "Spring cleaning" can happen any time of the year. This convenient and affordable option takes the burden of disposal off your hands. Bins are delivered to your residence and may be emptied more than once during the seven day period for an extra fee.

For larger projects, roll offs up to 40 cubic yards are also available for a seven day rental.

Please use your blue and green cans for all recyclable material. To order a temporary bin, call (909) 395-2050.

## Bulky Items

Bulky item collection is available all year long. Residents may request four bulky item collections per year free of charge. The City makes every effort to recycle bulky items. There is a five item limit per collection, and individual items must be easily handled by two people.

The following materials will be collected:

## Blue Containers are for **RECYCLABLES**



Items that can be placed in the **BLUE CONTAINER** are:

- Aluminum and steel cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastics with recycling logo  through 
- Styrofoam
- Newspapers
- Office paper/mixed paper
- Magazines/mail
- Telephone books
- Cardboard boxes
- Cereal boxes (with liners removed)
- Gift boxes
- Shipping boxes
- Metal coat hangers

When placing recyclables in container, make sure to:

- Flatten boxes
- Place items loose and not in plastic bags

Items that **CANNOT BE ACCEPTED** are:

- Ceramics
- Drinking glasses
- Food waste
- Household hazardous waste
- Light bulbs
- Mirrors
- Packaging materials
- Plastic bags
- Plastic wrap
- Scrap metal
- Window or safety glass



## Green Containers are for **GREEN WASTE**



Items that can be placed in the **GREEN CONTAINER** are:

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Brush
- Shrubbery prunings
- Tree trimmings
- Tree limbs less than six inches in diameter that fit in the container
- Palm fronds
- Cactus

**DO NOT** put items in plastic bags.

Items that **CANNOT BE ACCEPTED** are:

- Stumps or tree limbs larger than six inches in diameter
- Plastic bags
- Animal waste
- Dirt



## Backyard Composting

Backyard composting is an excellent way to recycle yard waste. The City provides free composting workshops that teach you how to transform leaves, twigs, and grass clippings into fertilizer and soil amendment. Ontario residents who attend the workshops are eligible to purchase a discounted compost bin. Check the Green Ontario newsletter or call (909) 395-2040 for upcoming workshop dates.



## Black Containers are for **REFUSE**



All non-recyclable material should be placed in the **BLACK CONTAINER**.

Items that **MUST NOT** be placed in containers include:

- Debris from construction, remodeling or demolition such as dirt, rocks, and concrete
- Toxic or flammable materials such as hot ashes.
- Household Hazardous Waste\*

## \*Household Hazardous Waste

Paint, oil, cleaners, and other household hazardous waste (HHW) including electronic waste, are accepted at:
