Abstract

This club was started on January 5, 1948 with 31 people in attendance. The purpose of the club was to "make it possible for amateurs to take better pictures with their limited equipment," according to Pierre Woodman, the newly elected president and local architect. Clint Bryant, now famous for his photos of Armstrong roses and the General Electric plant, was elected vice president. The club held contests and had featured speakers at the monthly meetings that helped members take better slides and photos.

The scrapbooks contain news clippings, photos, and club newsletters. The club carried on until 1990. The last scrapbook from 1984-1990 shows more obituary notices of members than newsletters.
