Summer Field Trips

All field trips include a docent-led tour of the museum's permanent exhibits, Road Ways and Gem of the Foothills and a hands-on activity. An advance teacher packet will be available upon request and include teacher background materials, student worksheets and post-activities. The museum store can be made available for students/campers if arranged at the time of reservation.

Singing the Golden State

Popular songs about the State of California, dating from the Gold Rush through the vaudeville era, are celebrated in this exhibit. Along with other printed materials, sound recordings, instruments, and memorabilia relating to California and its early musical life will be on display. It will provide visitors with an in-depth introduction to the state's varied musical past, including Gold Rush tunes, the development of musical theater, vaudeville, sheet music, publishing, popular music and the state song, "I Love You, California," composed in 1913.

Permanent Exhibitions

Road Ways examines the impact of the road and highway on American life and culture. Discover the roots of the road, how people have traveled "roads" long before cars did. Highlights include Ontario's Euclid Avenue, Holt Boulevard and historic Route 66.

Gem of the Foothills explores the unique history of Ontario – its founding, transitions, people and organizations. Explore Ontario from its roots beginning with the Native peoples and Californio Ranchos to its founding by George Chaffey. Discover why it has been called both a "Model Colony" and the "Gem of the Foothills".

Planning Your Visit

Please read this information carefully before scheduling your trip to the museum or outreach to your school/site.

Reservations – The museum requires a two-week notice for all tour and outreach reservations; call (909) 395-2510 or email museumtour@ci.ontario.ca.us.

Payment – Admission and tour fees are free, but donations are greatly appreciated.



Cancellations – The museum requires a one-week notice for all tour or outreach cancellations.

Confirmations – The museum will confirm your reservation about two weeks prior to your trip or outreach. Confirmations will include a letter, reservation form, chaperone information, museum rules of behavior and teacher packet with exhibit background and activities if requested. Be sure to read your letter and reservation thoroughly to confirm your tour date and time is correct.

Eating Area – The courtyard and surrounding grounds are available for your students to eat lunch/snack; however this must be arranged with museum staff at the time of your reservation. In the case of inclement weather, the museum does not have indoor eating facilities. Please note that refrigerated storage is NOT available.

Arrival Time – We ask that you be prompt when arriving to the museum. If you are planning to shuttle your group to/from your site to the museum, please allow enough time that your entire group will arrive before your tour time begins. Important information is shared at the beginning of the tour and your students/campers will miss out on activities by arriving late. Please mention that you plan to shuttle your group to/from the museum at the time of reservation so museum staff is aware that students/campers will be on the properties before and after their tour times. Also please make sure adequate chaperones are provided with your group during this time.
